HEALTHY EATING - III



MILK: Milk consumption in moderation provides health benefits to all age groups, more so in the young growing years. Most mammals stop drinking milk soon after weaning, but humans are the only species that consumes milk throughout life. The consumption of milk, with or without added vitamin D gives rise to greater rate of height Increase, body weight, Total bone mineral mass and Bone mineral density.

People at risk of cardiovascular disease and those wishing to reduce weight should avoid consuming full fat milk. However, the minerals in milk specifically calcium and potassium may help to control Blood pressure. For young children, milk being an excellent source of Calcium and Phosphorus helps in

development and maintenance of strong, healthy bones and Teeth.

Milk is also a rich source of vitamin (especially vitamin B12) and vitamin B2 (Riboflavin) but the only <mark>vitamin absent in milk is vitamin C. White gold or milk contains Nutrients which are important for </mark> Bone health like Calcium, Phosphorus, Vitamin D and Protein. The unique combination of Calcium, potassium, and magnesium in milk is responsible for Good Brain health.



Vegan milk: Plant based milks like 2. Almond milk. 1. Soya milk, 3. Oats milk

are good for people with cardiac disease because they are gluten free and Lactose free. They are slightly low in calories with exception of coconut milk Dr. Radhika Rajagopal, MBBS, DPH, which has saturated fats.



Milk in another form like Yogurt (fermented milk) is good for maintaining gut health.

USE MORE FIBRE RICH COMPLEX CARBOHYDRATE FOODS!

The fibre present in foods traps the sugars and gradually releases it into the blood stream, thereby preventing a sudden rise of sugars in the blood stream. Thus it is important to include at least one serving (100gm) fibre rich food with each meal.
